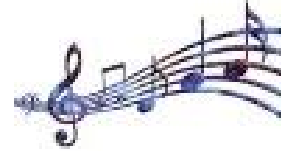
### Sunday Night Life – Sunday, 18th of June

## Secondary Snippets

**Parenting Teens** - Recently I attended The Mental Health and Wellbeing of Young People Conference at UQ in Brisbane. There were many topics discussed that day and it took a lot to digest all of the information. There were, however, a few key issues that came through often. The wellbeing of our young people is paramount to their being able to function at school and in the general wider community. As adults, we need to be actively finding ways to connect with teens to enhance their positive outlook of themselves.

**Some of the suggestions highlighted were:**

- ) Good social relationships are important
- ) Getting plenty of sleep helps memory, concentration and both mental and physical health
- ) Turn screens off in plenty of time before bedtime
- ) A protective factor that is recognised is having a family meal together
- ) Importance for teens to do things that they enjoy and which give a sense of accomplishment
- ) The need for a trusted adult to bounce ideas off
- ) Talking about mental health will normalise it, not stigmatise it
- ) Encourage young people to help each other to find help if they are concerned

There was also some interesting brain research presented. As adults, we need to understand that the teenage brain undergoes major changes during this time, and this is considered one of two most vulnerable times in our brain development. The teen's brain is in many ways closer to a child's brain than an adult's. The teen's brain CEO (organiser) is the last part to develop, and this is displayed by them having difficulty in organising several tasks at a time, making good judgements, and emotional regulation. When we consider this information, we start to see where we can support our children through these years, and begin to understand why they do the things they do. This information was presented by Michael C Nagel PhD from University of Sunshine Coast. Let me know if you would like further information about this area. 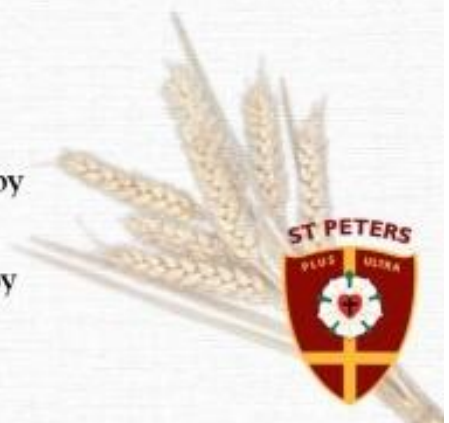
